SEALANTS

What are sealants and their benefits?

By placing a resin material in the pits and fissures of back teeth it helps lower the chance of getting tooth decay (cavities) on those surfaces. This is helpful during the most vulnerable time in a person's life of getting cavities: the childhood to adolescent years. Of course home care and diet play a major role in decay prevention, sealants can help while a child is learning brushing, flossing and refining their eating habits. It should be noted that a sealant does not cover the entire tooth, it only protects the pits and fissures of a tooth, therefore other areas are still vulnerable to decay.

What are their risks?

- 1. Loosening or dislodging: Sealants are not permanent. Part or all of the sealant may come off. This is usually due to things beyond a dentist's or hygienist's control, like how hard a patient chews, how the teeth come together, chewing hard or sticky foods. We will replace a sealant at no charge if it comes off within two (2) years. After that, the replacement of the sealant will be at the regular fee.
- 2. Leakage or decay: Inadequate home care and diet can still overpower the protective forces of a sealant and the tooth can still become decay

What are my alternatives?

As with any dental procedure you can choose not to proceed with care. Of course, that decision has its own set of benefits and risks.
